Located in the beautiful Brainerd Lakes Area of Minnesota, Confidence Learning Center (otherwise known as Camp Confidence) specializes in outdoor education and experiences for persons with developmental and cognitive disabilities along with the deaf and hard of hearing communities. Campers are brought to Camp from all over Minnesota and the mid-west by their staff, family or care giver, which is responsible for their direct care. The typical overnight group stay is two – three nights, however, longer or shorter visits are available. Visiting groups include group homes, families, public schools, state facilities, treatment centers, achievement centers and scout groups. Confidence Learning Center is open to all ages.
